We believe that group should only be organized to play 1-2 times per week. Family, school, and other activities are important in the development of kids as well. While sport naturally brings out everyone's competitive side (players, coaches, and parents) and we want to see our kids succeed, FunTeam groups should focus on developing skill, having fun, and making new friends in an atmosphere that makes everyone feel safe and comfortable to participate within their own capabilities. How do you plan on accomplishing this during EVERY FunTeam session?
Family Oriented/Volunteer Driven FunTeam Groups are started just by an idea (usually by an individual like yourself) but requires the help of many more to succeed and sustain. Our belief is that families want to be a part of their kids' lives and their pastimes and should have that opportunity! How will you recruit volunteers that also believe in the FunTeam model?
